On the Eastern Caribbean Securities Market today, 1,650,000 units of the Government of Saint Lucia's 8-year bond, trading symbol LCG080328, traded at 7.0%.

On the Regional Government Securities Market, the Government of Saint Lucia's 180-day Treasury bill auctioned on the ECSE's primary market platform raised \$18.5 million. The competitive uniform price methodology used, resulted in a discount rate of 2.95626%.
