Year to date revenue (January to June 2018) grew by 4% compared to the same period of the prior year. We continue to see growth in our CwC Business segment reflecting growth of 12% over the previous period. While we have been able to increase our customer base on the residential side, revenue per subscriber has declined year on year by 8.8%. The decline in revenue per subscriber is mainly driven by the voice cannibalization that have seen as more and more customer utilize the various VOIP options.

Compared to the previous quarter of the year, revenue also increased by 3%, also driven mainly by our CwC Business segment and increased revenues from our Residential Broadband primarily as a result of the investments. These investments are now delivering the returns as we have seen significant increase in the customer experience as reflected in our year on years improved net promoter scores.

We are committed to continue to invest in the network with an aim of improving our customer experience which will continue driving growth for the business. The introduction of our FLOW TV in 2017 was an exciting addition to our product portfolio. We have received positive feedback to the product.

At 30 June 2018, the Company had cash and cash equivalents of \$0.75m. These amounts are highly liquid and are a significant component of the Company's overall liquidity and capital resources. Liquidity forecasts are produced on a regular basis to ensure the utilization of current facilities is optimized, to ensure covenant compliance and that medium-term liquidity is maintained for the purpose of identifying long-term strategic funding requirements.

Year to date capital expenditure was \$3.3m. Projects such as the ECTEL LNP project, which allows customers to enjoy number portability and The Broadband Revolution project, which enhances the customer experience by increased internet speeds, were the main contributors for the capital spend.
