## PART VII THE COMPANY

1. (a) Provide brief history of the company since its inception to the present time.

The Bank of Nevis Limited (BON) was incorporated on 29 August 1985 and is licensed to conduct banking activities under the Banking Act of St. Christopher and Nevis, No 4 of 2004.

The Bank of Nevis Limited group consists of the following companies:

- Bank of Nevis International Limited (BONI) 1998: (International Banking)
- Bank of Nevis International Fund Limited 2004: (Mutual Fund)
- Bank of Nevis International Fund Managers Limited 2004: (Fund Management)
- Bank of Nevis Mutual Fund Limited 2005: (Mutual Fund)
- Bank of Nevis Fund Managers Limited 2005: (Fund Management)
- (b) Provide a description of the developments in the company's main line of business including accomplishments and future plans.

The Bank of Nevis Limited commenced service to the public in December 1985 with five (5) staff. The total assets amounted to EC\$250,103, and shareholders' equity EC\$241,000. In 1998, the subsidiary Bank of Nevis International was established to provide offshore banking services. The Bank continues to realize growth in all areas and has contributed significantly to the development of the Federation of St. Kitts & Nevis. As at June 30, 2015, the BON Group employed a staff of sixty-one (61), with total assets of EC\$575.91 million and shareholders' equity of EC\$54.65 million.

(c) Describe in detail what business the company does and proposes to do, including what products or goods are or will be produced or services that are or will be rendered.

The Bank's principal business carried on by the Parent (Domestic) Bank is the provision of financial services. The Bank is guided by the Banking Act No. 4 of 2004 of St. Christopher and Nevis. BON is also a licensed full service broker-dealer firm, authorised to trade on the Eastern Caribbean Securities Exchange (ECSE) and the Regional Government Securities Market (RGSM).

International banking services are provided through the main subsidiary, Bank of Nevis International Limited (BONI). BONI is guided by the Nevis International Banking Ordinance of 2014. The Bank also launched its International Mutual Fund in 2004, however, due to lack of desired growth, the operations of that fund were suspended. The domestic fund is yet to commence operations.

The Group's marketing efforts are co-ordinated by the Marketing Unit under the direction of the Customer Service and Marketing Committee. Advertising for the Group is undertaken locally via radio, internet, social, television, and print media; and regionally and internationally via print media. The Group also benefits from direct personal marketing through its directors, employees, and other group presentations.

The Bank's Financial Complex was completed in October 2014. The Bank's properties consist of the following:

- 1. Land and buildings on Main Street, Charlestown The Financial Complex in which the 'North Wing' hosts the operations of the Domestic Bank and the 'South Wing' hosts the operations of BONI, as well as administrative offices for the Domestic Bank.
- 2. Two plots of land at Featherbed Alley et.al (east of the Bank's main buildings) which will be utilized for parking.

The Bank's registered offices are located on the island of Nevis, and it offers retail banking services to both local and overseas clients. There are five other commercial banks operating within that market. The local financial market is also comprised of credit unions and other non-bank financial institutions.

The Bank's main subsidiary, Bank of Nevis International Limited, provides international banking services and since its inception in 1998, remains the only such financial institution within the Federation of St. Kitts and Nevis.

The Bank operates in a highly competitive environment. There are five additional commercial banks as well as several credit unions, a development bank, a finance company and other financial institutions competing for business in a relatively small market. The international bank competes with other banks in the world's offshore centres.

The Bank of Nevis Ltd is an indigenous bank with issued capital of EC\$9,347,687. Most of the Bank's competitors have larger capital bases and serve larger markets. The Bank, however, continues to demonstrate its ability to be profitable in a small market environment by maintaining a competitive advantage with its product pricing, and a wide range of products and services — making it a one-stop-bank. With a strong and empowered management team, The Bank of Nevis Limited is confident it can continue to compete successfully in the markets it serves.
