Welcome to the Eastern Caribbean Securities Exchange daily update for 13th October 2008, providing the latest trading information and financial tips for the investor.

On the Eastern Caribbean Securities Market today, 100 East Caribbean Financial Holding Company Limited shares traded at \$14.50 down twenty-five cents or 1.69% since its last traded price, 1,813 Grenreal Property Corporation Limited shares traded at \$5.40 unchanged from it previous traded price, 50 Republic Bank (Grenada) Limited shares traded at \$55.00 down two dollars or 3.51% since it last market close and 1,000 St Kitts Nevis Anguilla National Bank shares traded at \$2.99 up one cent or 0.34% on its last traded price.

Also, The Government of Antigua and Barbuda's 91-day, \$17 million (Eastern Caribbean dollar) Treasury bill issue, auctioned on the Regional Government Securities Market using the primary market platform of the Eastern Caribbean Securities Exchange (ECSE), was oversubscribed. A competitive uniform price auction methodology was used and the resulting discount rate was 6.00 per cent.
