The Government of Antigua and Barbuda's 91-day, EC\$17 million Treasury bill issue, auctioned on the Regional Government Securities Market using the primary market platform of the Eastern Caribbean Securities Exchange (ECSE), was oversubscribed by \$6.949 million. A competitive uniform price auction methodology was used and the resulting discount rate was 6.00 per cent.
