Welcome to the Eastern Caribbean Securities Exchange daily update for 23 June 2009 providing the latest trading information and financial tips for the investor.

On the Eastern Caribbean Securities Market today 100,000 Bank of Nevis shares traded at \$6.05 down five cents or 0.82% on its previous traded price, 506 St Kitts Nevis Anguilla National Bank shares traded at a low of \$2.97 and at a high of \$2.98 representing a 0.67% increase on its last market close and 20,000 TDC shares traded at \$2.00 down twenty cents or 9.09% on it last traded price.

Also, The Nevis Island Administration's 365-day, Treasury bill issue, auctioned on the Regional Government Securities Market using the primary market platform of the Eastern Caribbean Securities Exchange raised \$13.324 million. A competitive uniform price auction methodology was used and the resulting discount rate was 6.75 per cent.
