Why do companies set record dates?

Companies set record dates to determine its official shareholders at a particular date in order to make dividend payments. For example, FCI may declare a dividend, payable on May 5, 2010 to all shareholders on record as at April 15, 2010. If a trade is executed on April 13, settlement takes place on April 14 and the buyer becomes the new holder before April 15 and is entitled to the dividend payment. On the other hand, if someone becomes the holder of the securities after April 15 they would not be entitled to dividends.
