General Discussion and Analysis of Financial Condition

Financial Review January 2021 - March 2021

The closure of the borders and the measures implemented to manage the COVID-19 pandemic continues to severely restrict economic activity.

The high level of unemployment has significantly reduced demand in all sectors of the economy and increased the risk of default on outstanding receivable balances.

The Group recorded a loss before tax for the quarter of \$764 compared to a profit of \$3,472,662 in the prior year. The loss is a direct result of reduced consumer demand. Sales for the quarter were \$32,291,889, which is a 16% reduction from the same period last year.

The company has instituted measures to monitor and manage its cost; however, without a revival of consumer demand, the outlook for the balance of the year is guarded.

The company is sufficiently funded to mitigate these challenges with a current ratio of 2.04 and a debt to equity ratio of 0.23 : 1

Liquidity and Capital Resources

While there was a loss for the quarter, the group has reduced its net loan position over the last six months by \$1.6M and improved its bank balance by \$1.1M.

The group has untapped approved credit facilities at its disposal, which will mitigate any short-term liquidity risk.

All loans and interest were paid on time.

There are no capital commitments.

The Group Net Profit Before Tax for the six months ended March 2021 was \$4,214,257 compared to \$8,485,354 in the prior year. The reduction in profit of \$4,271,097 (50%) resulted directly from the economic fallout of the COVID 19 pandemic.
The Group is optimistically projecting a profit before tax of \$2,605,684 for the next six months. The projection is contingent on the recovery of the local economy and the management of the COVID 19 pandemic.
