General Discussion and Analysis of Financial Condition

At the end of the reporting period (30 September 2021), total Assets amounted to \$891 million. When compared to the audited position at June 30, 2021, total Assets decreased by \$18 million or 2%. This quarterly decrease was mainly due to the following factors:

- The Investment & Treasury portfolio recorded a decrease of \$12.4 million or 3.2%;
- The Loans and advances portfolio decreased by \$5.6 million or 1.2%.

Customers' Deposits:

At the end of the first quarter (30 September 2021), the Customer Deposits portfolio amounted to \$758.1 million, which represented a decrease of \$12.5 million or 1.6% when compared to the balance reported as at June 30, 2021 (\$770.6 million). The net decrease was primarily attributed to the current accounts category, which declined by \$20.8 million or 12.1% when compared to June 2021. This decrease was offset by increases noted in the Fixed Deposits and Savings Deposits categories which increased by \$6.5 million or 2.4% and \$2.1 million or 0.6% respectively.

Discussion of Liquidity and Capital Resources

As at 30 September 2021, the Bank recorded liquid assets amounting to \$277.1 million or 31.1% of total assets. The Bank had adequate funds on hand to meet any operational demands or related obligations which arose. The Bank's liquidity portfolio comprised primarily of correspondent bank balances, short term deposits with banks and financial institutions, as well as investments in short-term treasury bills via local and regional government bodies.

Part of management's monitoring process on a daily basis includes an on-going assessment of liquidity ratios. The liquidity ratios assessed include the reserve position and liquid assets to total deposits. Commercial banks operating in the Eastern Caribbean Currency Union (ECCU) are mandated to hold at least 6% of their deposits with the ECCB. The reserve position and liquid assets to total deposits ratios were above the regulatory benchmarks with 8.7% and 36.5% respectively being reported as at 30 September 2021.

At 30 September 2021, total shareholders' equity stood at \$107.5 million; a decrease of \$0.7 million or 0.6% when compared to June 2021.

As at September 30, 2021, the Bank had paid up capital of \$24.3 million which exceeds the minimum paid up capital requirement of \$20 million for a licensed financial institution per the 2015 Banking Act.

Overview of Results of Operations

For the three month period ended 30 September 2021, a net loss after tax amounting to \$0.5 million was recorded. This represented a decline of \$1.2 million when compared to the profit recorded for the same quarter one year ago.

Interest Income

Interest income increased by \$1.7 million or 29.4% to \$7.6 million when compared to the quarter ended September 2020 (\$5.9 million). This growth in interest income was mainly attributed to interest income from loans and advances which expanded by \$1.4 million or 29.8%.

Interest Expense

Interest expense for the quarter amounted to \$3.5 million, reflecting an increase of \$1.1 million when compared to the quarter ended September 2020. The growth in Interest Expense was due to the growth in Savings and Fixed Customer deposits from the acquisition of RBC/RBTT in April 2021 as well as the increase in Savings and Fixed Deposits recorded for the quarter ended September 2021 when compared to June 2021.

Operating Expenses

Total operating expenses for the quarter ended 30 September 2021 amounted to \$5.5 million, an increase of \$2.2 million or 66.3% when compared to the quarter ended 30 September 2020. The main contributor to the increase was the General and Administrative expenses category which increased by \$1.7 million. The increase in this category was primarily due to the extra cost incurred for the acquired employees, as well as other acquisition related expenses.

The Bank is exposed to diverse risks in the conduct of its daily operations. Some of the major risks facing the Bank are outlined below:

Credit Risk:

Credit Risk is the most predominant risk factor within the Bank's environment. This represents the risk of incurring a financial loss in the event that any of the Bank's customers or counterparties fail to fulfill their contractual obligations to the Bank. The Bank's credit risk arises mainly from the loans and advances portfolio which as at 30 September 2021 constituted 51% of the Banks total assets. The Bank is also exposed to other credit risks arising from investments in debt securities and other exposures from its trading activities.

Foreign Exchange Risk:

The Bank takes on exposure to the effects of fluctuations in the prevailing foreign currency exchange rates on its financial position and cash flows. These currency positions are monitored daily. Most of the Bank's assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are held in United States dollars. The exchange rate of the Eastern Caribbean dollar (XCD\$) to the United States dollar (US\$) has been formally pegged at XCD\$2.7 = US\$1.00. Foreign exchange exposure in Pound Sterling, Canadian, Euro and other currencies are minimum balances held with correspondent accounts.

Market Risk

The Bank takes on exposure to market risk, which is the risk that the fair value or future cash flows of a financial instrument will fluctuate because of changes in market prices. Market risks arise from open positions in interest rate, currency and equity products, all of which are exposed to general and specific market movements and changes in the level of volatility of market rates or prices such as interest rates, credit spreads, foreign exchange rates and equity prices. The Bank separates exposures to market risk into either trading or non-trading portfolios.

The market risks arising from trading and non-trading portfolios are monitored by the Risk Management Committee, Investment and Internal Management Investment Committee and by Management.

Liquidity Risk

Liquidity risk is the risk that the Bank is unable to meet its obligations when they fall due as a result of customer deposits being withdrawn, cash requirements from contractual commitments, or other cash outflows, such as debt maturities. Such outflows would deplete available cash resources for client lending, trading activities and investments. In extreme circumstances, lack of liquidity could result in reductions in the consolidated statement of financial position and sales of assets, or potentially an inability to fulfill lending commitments. The risk that the bank will be unable to do so is inherent in all banking operations and can be affected by a range of institution specific

and market-wide events including, but not limited to, credit events, merger and acquisition activity, systemic shocks and natural disasters. The Banks portfolio of liquid assets amounted to \$277.1 million or 31.1% of total assets at the end of the quarter.
